# Highlights of the Year

## reNEWed

This year the ReNEWed program was shared with over 2,222 student participants in over 20 Oakland County schools. ReNEWed is our middle school program with a strong curriculum for youth to apply when faced with stress and difficult feelings.

## Resolve

In 2022, the Resolve program provided comprehensive life skills to over 189 individuals both virtually and in person. Turning Point Recovery, Grace Centers of Hope, Meridian and Ascension are a few of our participating organizations.

## reNEWed Jr.

Through a partnership with Variety Children's Charity of Detroit, the development and implementation began to address 3rd through 5th grade youth to provide tools to deal with stress, anxiety and other difficult feelings.

## Save A Life

The Alliance performed over 125 free community Narcan trainings both virtually and in person with 2,539 trained on this essential lifesaving tool during an opioid overdose emergency.

## Alliance Wellness Program

This year, there were over 3,224 viewers of the online World of Wellness with 36 presenters and practitioners. Additionally the Annual Family Fun Wellness Expo drew the attention of 325 participants in Royal Oak and 300 in Holly.

## Keep Them Safe, Keep Them Healthy

With a focus on decreasing substance misuse and educating students on healthy choice making, the Alliance presented to 876 students and 16 parents on the truth about vaping, 709 students on the impact of marijuana on the developing brain, and 134 students on the impact of underage drinking.

## Prevention Programs

We are proud to say our prevention programs were delivered to over 3,500 Oakland County middle and high school students last year!

## SMART Recovery

Pivoting from Shatter the Stigma to SMART Recovery, this support group includes over 1,123 attendees year to date. SMART Recovery is a fresh approach to addiction recovery. It is a transformative method of moving from addictive substances and negative behaviors to a life of positive self-regard and willingness to change.

## Community Impact

EVERY SINGLE COMMUNITY in Oakland County was impacted by our programs being delivered through and with our Coalitions; our partners in healthcare; our police, fire and rescue colleagues; and so many more collaborators!

## The 5K Returns!

In 2022, the Alliance and its supporters were thrilled to return to an in-person 5K at Clawson City Park. We had 208 registered runners and walkers! Nine teams raised \$6,525 for our work. And, our total revenue reached nearly \$20,000. We couldn't ask for a better day! Save the date for June 3, 2023!

# Partners Making an Impact

## Drug-Free Communities

The Alliance received a \$125,000 grant from the **Drug-Free Communities (DFC)** Support Program.

These grants are meant to provide local community coalitions funding to prevent youth substance use, including prescription drugs, marijuana, tobacco and alcohol.



## United Way

As part of Oakland County Executive, David Coulter's **Oakland Together Community Response and Recovery Fund**, the United Way for Southeastern Michigan provided \$102,069 for the Alliance's ReNEWed program to address the challenges youth experienced due to the Covid-19 pandemic.



## Oakland Community Health Network

The Alliance received \$1,725,000 for fiscal year 2021-2022 from **Oakland Community Health Network (OCHN)**. OCHN and its network of service providers identify, influence, and deliver public mental health services to more than 23,000+ Oakland County citizens.



## Private Support

Fundraising throughout the year via special events, corporate and foundation support, and personal donations resulted in funding to the Alliance of \$38,212.



## SAMHSA STOP Act

The Alliance was awarded \$50,000 from SAMHSA for the **Sober Truth on Preventing Underage Drinking Act (STOP Act)** grants. The goal of this program is to prevent and reduce alcohol use among youth and young adults.



## SAMHSA

The Alliance was awarded \$259,888 from SAMHSA Strategic Prevention Framework - **Partnerships for Success** grant. The purpose is to prevent the onset and reduce the progression of substance abuse and its related problems while strengthening prevention capacity and infrastructure.

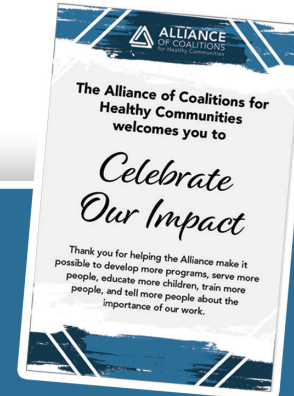
