Reaching People in 2018



The Alliance worked hard this year to reach people - getting out into the community educating, speaking, supporting and encouraging...

- 53 FAN meetings held resulting in 600+ adults receiving support and education
- 24 Save A Life Naloxone trainings conducted resulting in 638 individuals trained
- **Keep Them Safe Keep Them Healthy** brought to 15 schools, 1 university and multiple churches reaching 4,600 youth and 428 adults
- **Life is Your Playbook**: 17 schools, 2 large outside venues, Boy Scouts reaching a total of 2,066 youth and 684 adults
- **World of Wellness**: First annual wellness symposium

Fiscal Year Funding

October 2017 - September 2018



The Alliance received \$1,387,436 for fiscal year 2017-2018 from Oakland Community Health Network (OCHN). OCHN and its network of service providers identify, influence, and deliver public mental health services to more than 25,800 Oakland County citizens.

The Alliance was awarded a \$125,000 grant from the Drug-Free Communities (DFC) Support Program. These grants are meant to provide local community coalitions funding to prevent youth substance use, including prescription drugs, marijuana, tobacco and alcohol.

The Alliance's efforts to mentor Genesee County Community Coalition and Lakes Area Community Coalition were increased thanks to a \$75,000 grant from the Drug-Free Communities Mentoring Support Program (DFCM). Extensive training on the Strategic Prevention Framework and capacity building to increase prevention efforts were a strong focus this year.

Blue Cross Blue Shield's *Taking Action on Opioid and Prescription Drug Abuse in Michigan by Supporting Community Responses* grant allows the Alliance to implement a three-pronged strategy that increased resources for Oakland County residents to combat the negative consequences of the opioid epidemic including Naloxone training, piloting Resolve, and increasing the availability of prescription drug disposal opportunities throughout Oakland County.

Other donations consisted of things that the Alliance did throughout the year such as special events and support of donors resulting in funding to the Alliance of \$30,287.
